

Minoshi

Minogami or Minoshi is one of the oldest papers originally produced as the name suggests, in the Mino region. The oldest fragments date from 702. From the beginning, the production is large. Mino during the Heian period (794-1185) is the largest producing region of Japan as well for bark as for paper. Names derived from the general name like Mino shoinshi (for shoin shoji) are used since the Edo period (1603-1868). Honminogami (true Minogami) means a paper respecting the manufacturing label. The standard size is 33/24,3cm. It is used for various purposes of writing, printing, covering sliding doors etc.
